

SUMMARY

A preliminary survey shows that 151 persons died in fires in the second quarter of 1969. One hundred and thirty-five of these were in England and Wales and 16 in Scotland. There were no fatal casualties in Northern Ireland. This is lower than the total for the first quarter of the year.

Two fires involving oil heaters each led to the deaths of four children in Birmingham. A fire in Durham, caused by children playing, gave rise to five deaths.

INTRODUCTION

This report is the sixth of a series of quarterly reports giving preliminary information on deaths in fires attended by fire brigades. The information it contains is based on reports of fires during the second quarter of 1969 received by 1st August 1969 and the figures are subject to revision.

The format of these notes has been altered slightly to provide separate figures for each quarter and not for first six months, etc. as was done in 1969. Consequently the figures in this report are not comparable with the second report in 1968¹.

During the second quarter of 1969, 135 persons died in 110 fires in England and Wales. Sixteen multiple death incidents gave rise to 41 deaths. In Scotland there were 16 deaths in 14 fires. No deaths were reported in Fire in Northern Ireland.

The black spot this quarter appears to have been Birmingham, where two fires involving oil heaters each accounted for the deaths of four children; in one of these fires the children had been left alone. A fire in Durham which accounted for five deaths occurred early in the morning as the result of children playing with fire and leaving doors open.

Tables 1-4 give details of hazards, times of call, sources of ignition and ages of buildings. Table 5 gives details of the age and sex of fatal casualties and Table 5A shows causes of death (a new table). Table 6 gives the numbers of fatal and non-fatal casualties in each brigade area.
