FIRE DEATHS IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1970

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SUMMARY

A preliminary survey shows that 242 persons died in fires in the first quarter of 1970. Two hundred and nine of these were in England and Wales, 30 in Scotland and three in Northern Ireland. This figure is slightly higher than the preliminary estimate for the first quarter of 1969.

The most serious incident was at a hospital in which five elderly men died. There were eleven deaths attributed to electric blankets in England and Wales, compared with three in the first quarters of each of the two previous years.

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INTRODUCTION

This report is the ninth of a series of quarterly reports giving preliminary information of deaths in fires attended by fire brigades. The information it contains is based on reports of fires during the first quarter of 1970 received by 28 April 1970 and the figures are subject to revision.

During the first quarter of 1970, 209 persons died in 184 fires in England and Wales. Nineteen of these fires gave rise to more than one death. In Scotland there were 30 deaths in 26 fires - in Northern Ireland two fatal fires resulted in three deaths. These figures are slightly higher than the preliminary estimates for the first quarter of 1969¹, but lower than that for the same period in 1968².

The worst incident during the quarter was at a hospital in Exeter in which five elderly men lost their lives. There was a disturbing high number of incidents attributed to electric blankets, eleven deaths being reported in England and Wales compared with three in the corresponding quarter in each of the previous two years.

Tables 1-4 give details of hazards, times of call, sources of ignition and dates of construction of buildings. Table 5 gives details of the age and sex of fatal casualties; Table 5A shows causes of deaths. Table 6 gives the numbers of fatal and non-fatal casualties in each brigade area.
