SUMMARY

A preliminary survey shows that there were 147 fatal casualties in fires attended by fire brigades in England and Wales during the first quarter of 1971. The corresponding figures for Scotland and Northern Ireland were 31 and 2 respectively. It is likely that because of an industrial dispute involving the fire services these figures are underestimates of the true figures.

INTRODUCTION

This report is one of a series of quarterly reports giving preliminary information on deaths in fires attended by fire brigades. It is based on information received by 30th April 1971 and is subject to revision. It is probable that some deaths and injuries are not included because of an industrial dispute involving the fire brigades; as a result the information in this note is not comparable with other notes in the series.

One hundred and forty-seven fatal casualties were reported in England and Wales, 31 in Scotland and 2 in Northern Ireland. Non-fatal casualties numbered 666, 64 and 14 respectively in the same areas.

Tables 1-5 give details of hazards, times of call, sources of ignition, dates of construction, age and sex and causes of deaths. Table 6 gives the numbers of fatal and non-fatal casualties in each brigade area
